Inmate breaks cell window

An inmate at the Mendocino County Jail who was arrested Friday for allegedly breaking a door in had another vandalism charge added to his charges after he allegedly broke the window of a holding cell, according to the Mendocino County Sheriff's Office.

Ukiah police arrested Jose D. Nunez, 24, at 2:11 a.m. Friday when a caller in the 700 block of Waugh Lane reported first that someone was knocking on their front door, then that the person "busted in the door" just after 2 a.m., according to the Ukiah Police Department activity log.

Nunez allegedly started pounding and kicking the cell door at 6 a.m., according to the MCSO, including repeated pounding on a reinforced glass panel in the door that was about waist-high. He pounded so hard that the glass suddenly shattered, according to the MCSO, causing \$1,500 of damage.

A charge of felony vandalism was added to Nunez's charges, and he is held at the jail without bail.

Fatal ATV crash

A 59-year-old Eureka man died in an ATV crash Saturday on Lone Pine Ranch, according to the California Highway Patrol.

Gary R. Gundersen was part of a hunting party on the property and was driving a 2004 Honda ATV south on the ranch, about a mile east of Island Mountain Road at about noon.

"Due to unknown circumstances," the ATV overturned and killed Gundersen, who was not wearing a helmet, according to the CHP.

personnel aided CHP at the scene. Authorities do not suspect that drugs or alcohol were a factor in the incident. The Garberville Area CHP is investigating the collision.

Cocaine found in traffic stop

Two Ukiah residents who were stopped north of the city Friday were arrested on drug charges after a Sheriff's deputy allegedly found cocaine in the vehicle, according to the Mendocino County Sheriff's Office.

A deputy stopped the vehicle at 11 p.m. in the 1400 block of Lovers Lane for several traffic violations, according to the MCSO.

Passengers Anthony Aguilar, 26, and Nolan Lawson, 22, were arrested on suspicion of being under the influence of a controlled substance, and Aguilar was additionally arrested for allegedly possessing a controlled substance and violating his parole. Lawson was also arrested on suspicion of violating his probation.

Both men were booked at the Mendocino County Jail under no-bail holds.
